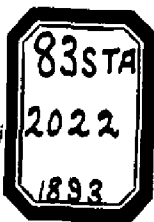


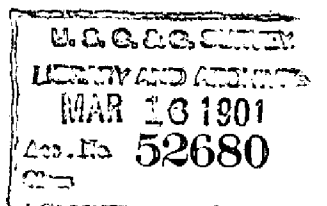

## Descriptive Report

to accompany Top<sup>c</sup> Sheet - N<sup>o</sup> 2022, part of D.C.

1. The general character of the ground is furnished by eroded hills of rounded form, apparently resting on a rock base.
8. The forest-growth is of oak and other hardwood trees, with an occasional conifer.

The old fields are largely covered by a scrubby growth of low pines, persimmons, Sassafras bushes, etc. The forest trees range from 50 to 80 feet in height.

Fruit trees are the apple, pear, peach, plum, etc.

9. About half the area surveyed is in forest and the rest in grass land, which is largely obstructed by scrubby brush.

13. The survey was for the special use of the Engineer Department of the District of Columbia, to serve as a basis for the extension of the streets and avenues to the District line.
