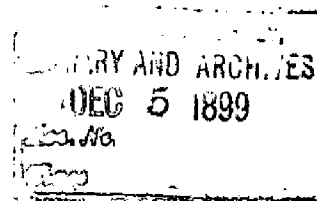

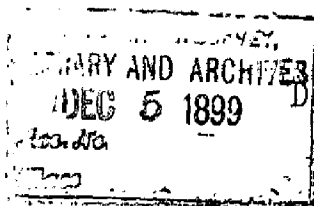

Sir:

In answer to your letter of November 28th, I have the honor to reply that Topographic Sheet No. 2267, of part of Mt. Mansfield, was made to show the configuration of the top of the mountain as an aid to find the triangulation point which is not situated on the highest peak of the mountain.

The sheet was made by Mr. L. S. Smith with the aid of a Fauth 4 inch Theodolite and an extemporized telemeter rod and cannot rank with plane-table sheets.
