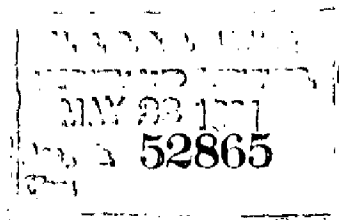

As there was no geographic position to start this work on, it became necessary to execute the topography by forward telemeter-distances, and then after the determination of the geographical positions transfer the topography to a projection.

The two spits are about two feet above ordinary high tide and are composed of fine gravel.

At the time that this survey was made Teller City was almost entirely under canvas, only the wooden and iron structures that had been built up to that date are indicated on the sheet.

The topographic features explain themselves.
