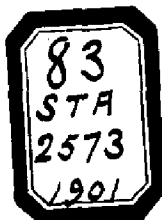

Wilde Cove is on the eastern shore of Gattobi Island about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the entrance to Lissanelli Strait. The entire part of the shore is a high rocky bluff, the inner part is above the sand beach and steep slopes broken rock.

The hill sides are covered with forests of Alaska fir and open patches of grass. The tree line is about 1500 ft. above the sea level. The hills in the immediate vicinity are about 800 ft. high. The island in the entrance is about 60 feet high and has high bluff shores with gullies in the northwestern side.

There are several small streams affording an abundance of fresh water.

The name Wilde gives the cove and island was suggested by their size. As there is no transportation station on this sheet, the projection was placed on it after the field work was done. The shore line was located and oriented by plane table work.
