NOTE

Heights are expressed in feet, And show the altitudes above mean high water, The curves of equal elevations are given for every 20 feet differ rence of level, and are indicated on the chart by red lines, The broken red lines, show the auxiliary heights, around the tops of hills, and the ten feet curves near than shore line.

All dwellings, are shown in solid black, barns and other buildings, in open figures, Telaphone lines, are shown same as telegraph lines, There is no telegraph service in the country covered by sheet N 2. This sheet was inked almost to completion before the "General Instructions for the Field work of the Coast and Geodetic Survey", were received.

The spelling of the name, "Corotoman" on C,&,G,Survey Chart No 392 Rap pahannock River, Sheet No I, is wrong, the name has but one (r) Some of the old records at Lancaster Court House Va, have the name spelled "Cerotoman" it is also spelled this way in the records at Christ Church near Irvington Va, Rebert(king) Carter of Corotoma" is there spoken of as having furnished the material and money to build Christ Church in I730.

(a) General of RIVER SHORE LINE.

The general appearance of the river shore line on the Piankatank and Rappahannock Rivers, and their tributaries is low bluffs, IO to 20 feet above mean high water, backed by hills gradually rising to an elevation of 60 and 80 feet above M,H,W, en South side of Piankatank, and 80 to 90 feet on the North side of the Piankatank, and to 98 feet on the north side of the Rappahannock River.

The shores of the rivers and creeks are for the greater part, dens ely wooded, with large timber area's in the interior, also many clear spaces that are thickly inhabited and under cultivation, The entire sheet is covered with a net work of publick and private roads.

() REFUGE.

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Geed shelter and safe ancherages, from all winds can be found any where on these rivers and their tributaries, for vessels drawing 16 feet, The above statement refers to the Piankatank above Horse Point, And the Rappahannock above Whitestone Wharf.

(g) ICE.

During the months of December-January-February and sometimes in March, The rivers and creeks are frezen everfor short periods each menth, and interfere with steamboat navigation for these four days at a time, and very seldem longer than one week at a time, when the ice breaks up it generally piles up on Sout shores of the rivers and creeks, and frequently does considerable damage to the wharves.

(t) PORTS, COMMERCIAL IMPORTANCE.

Freeport, at the head of steamboat navigation, on the Piankatank River, is a good shipping point, large quantities of lumber-grain- and garden truck are shipped from this point. Stanfer's-Green's- and Conrad's wharves on the same river are good shipping points,

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fro which grain-lumber and country products are shipped in large quantities, The steamers of the Maryland Delaware and Virginia Rail Way Campany, ply between these wharves and Baltimore three times a week.

Mill Creek-Whitestone and Berham's wherves on the Rappahannock and Millenbeck-Moran's-Ottiman Merry Point wherves, on the Ceroteman, are also good shipping points. Merry Point is the head of Steamboat navigation on the Coroteman River,

Weems and Irvington on Carter's Creek are important shipping point of Large shipments of fish cysters and country produce are made from these points. Messick's Factory on the West Prong of Carter's Creek, is a large plant for the manufacturingof Fertilizer, which is made from fish called "Menhaden", these fish ar? found in large schools, on the Lower Petomac-Chesapeake Bay to the Capes, and on the Atlantic Coast from Sandy Hock to Cape Look Out, North Caroli na, and are brought from these waters in large fishing steamers, te the different fertilizer plants on Chesapeake Bay and tributaries, FRES WATER, can be obtained from wells at all of the above named wharves, Artesian watercan be obtained at Messick's factory in Car ter's Creek, free of charge. At Green's wharf on the Piankatank, Millenbeck-Ottiman and Merry Point wherves wherves on the Coroto man river, at Weems and Irvington on Carters Creek, Extensive can ning plants are opperated for the preserving of tomatoes and sweet potatoes, Thousands of gallons of shucked oysters are shipped to Northen points from these places, every season.

Irvington on Carter's Creek, is a thriving up to date town with about one thousand inhabitants, eight good steeres one bank-one week by paper-post office-two churches-one town hall and one high school.

Christ Church built by Rebert (KING) Carter in 1730, is an interesting relic of Colonial times, and is located about 2 miles north from the post effice at Irvington. The term of Irvington covers an area of about 2,25 square miles, with the buildings much scattered

(u) CHANGE OF SHORE LINE.

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At some of the points on the river and creek shores, on sheet N2, the groun has washed away, and at other places the beach has fill ed in, since the last survey was made.

(w) SURVEY METHODS.

The work on Sheet N2, represents the resurvey of the Rappahannock -Piankat; ink and Cerotoman Rivers and tributaries, From Whitestone wharf to Regue's Point on the Rappahannock, Frem Toll's Point to Davis Cre lek on the Coretoman River, and from Herse Point to Turk 's Ferry on the Piankatank River. also the interior work, con touring -reads -creeks and other topographic detail, as far back from the streams to the high land everlooking therivers and stream and to king in the main and branch reads running towards the county seats; of Mahews-Gleucester-Middlsex and Lancaster, including the tewn s of Irvington and Kilmarnock, the vilages of Weems and Otti man, The highest elevation on this sheet is 98 feet above M,H,W, The heights are expressed in feet, and give the elevation above M,H,W, This roads were put in by plane table traverse lines brought up from) P T triangulation stations, and checked at every pessible

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(x) PLANE TABLE TRIANGULATION.

In the absence of a regular systim of triangulation, A plane table triangulation was centinued up the rivers from the P?T,Ang sta's en topographic sheet M2. All of the signals at thes stations were described, stations marked and the descriptions sent to the office September19/08, Ther are I66 plane table stations on sheets M2 & N2 that are marked and described, Four of these station Ava-Bank-Tell-and Up, on sheet N2 are marked with Terracotta pipe filled with cement (for centre marks) Kirk station, located in two feet of water, is marked with a piece of galvanised iron pipe filled with cement, In case it is intended to continue the work further up the Rappahannock River, well determined base lines can be recevered from which to start the plane tabl triangulation,

I6I of these stations are marked with Pine centre and reference stubs, copper tacks and galvanised iron nails, this sheet was part ly inked before the field work was completed.
