DESCRIPTIVE REPORT.

To accompany topog. sheet "L", sta. Kipaepae to Keaiwa Cairn, Island of Hawaii.

These limits embrace an important district: there is much more soil over the lava than over that shown on preceding West coast sheets, and in consequence, more vegetation, and more people. The coast is for the most part cliff line of varying height, and behind are alternate stretches of rough lava(kaa), and smooth lava(pahoehoe) and covered, except close to the shore, with scant growth of grass and weeds, but offering ~~sufficient~~ ^{sufficient} to herds of cattle, with which the country is covered. As before, the higher and farther inshore, the more luxuriant is the vegetation. From one to two miles inside the coast, there is a wide band of sugar cane, extending from South of Naalehu to Pahala and beyond. This is controlled by two sugar companies, and the common boundary is in the vicinity of Hilea. The Hutchinson Sugar Plantation Co. has Offices at Naalehu and the mill is situated at Honuapo. the Hawaiian Agricultural Co. Office and mill is at Pahala

From Kamehame N.E. to end of sheet the country is barren, except for infrequent grass patches. Below Puu Kolekole, in this area, is an interesting lava formation: the smooth lava has hardened in the process of pouring over high cliffs; presenting much the form of frozen materials. Two water holes were also found in this area, in positions indicated on sheet, and they were found invaluable in the prosecution of the work.

The main Govt. belt road traverses this sheet, and passes through the towns of Naalehu, Honuapo, Hilea and Pahala. There is a general store at Naalehu, also a post office, and as previously stated it has the office of the Hutchinson Sugar Plantation Co. At Honuapo is the boat landing: there is a fine wharf, built up on slender rods to escape the action of the swells. The S.S. Mauna Loa of the Inter-Island Steam Navigation Co. makes this port every ten days, proceeds on to Funaluu, and returns, sailing for Honolulu via way ports. Hilea is only a plantation camp for the Hutchinson Co. At Pahala is a hotel and restaurant, a post office, a general store, and the mill and office of the Hawaiian Agricultural Co.

Funaluu is the last port of call for the Mauna Loa. It discharges freight here and takes on sugar from the Pahala mill. No passengers are taken from here: they must embark from Honuapo. There is nothing at Funaluu beyond a few cottages occupied by natives. Funaluu offers a better smallboat landing than Honuapo, being protected to a slight extent from the prevailing N.E. swell. There is an excellent beach at this place. There is no water piped down to wharf at either Funaluu or Honuapo.
