-*TOWNS*

Elizabeth City is the only town on this sheet, and is the county seat of Pasquotank County, has a population of about eleven thousand.

DESCRIPTIVE REPORT FOR TOPOGRAPHIC SHEET NO.1 PASQUOTANK RIVER.

It is a handsome and enterprising town, and has all of the facilities found in a city of that size; has large lumber industries and the lake Drummond Dismal Swamp Canal, passes its front.

There is extensive transshipment of freight; also from the railroad to boats plying the North Carolina Sounds.

* *-SHORES* *

About half of these shores are marshy, and all low, rising rarely to the height of ten feet above the mean water surface.

The highest shores are generally sandy, with some stiff clay. The swampy shores usually bushy with some timber.

Stumps, awash, along shores are quite common and often dangerous to propellers; they are indicated on the sheet by cross marks. xx

SURFACE

The surface averages very flat, is slightly undulating and frequently cut into by wet and marshy belts. The land varies from sandy to heavy clay, and is productive.

WATER

The water of the Pasquotank is fresh and of a naturally good quality. The city water is abundant and accessible; obtained by pumping.

OCCUPATION

The occupation of the people outside of the city is farming. The city is a shipping and distributing center, and a large number of the people are engaged in this work.
