

Discriptive Report
to accompany Topographic Shoet 3647.
Cape Henry to Sewalls Point
Virginis
Surveyed 1916

This plane table survey of the south shore of Chesapeake Bay was made under instructions dated June 3, 1916.

A traverse was run from Cape Henry, Va., along the shore and across the mouth of Lynnhaven Inlot to Ocean Park; along the shore from Ocean Park to Ocean View; around Willoughby Spit and Willoughby Bay to the Ferry Wharf at Sewall's Point. A supplementary traverse was run from Cape Henry to Bayville Chimney along the tracks of the Norfolk Southern Railroad. Other small traverses were run to fill in the Topography about Mason's Creek.

The various Hydrographic signa's were located in this survey and used in the Hydrographic survey which followed the Topographic survey. All these signals were permanently marked and are discribed on form 524 which accompanys this sheet.

At Cape Henry the old Lighthouse stands about 100 meters S. W. of the new Lighthouse, both making excellent landmarks. The most prominent building at Cape Henry is a large green pavilion. There is a cluster of small buildings near the Lighthouses which includes the Weather Bureau and the homes of the light-keepers. Storm signals are displayed at Cape Henry and are reporting stations for Maryland and Virginia pilots.

Communications may be had by International Code and Morse.

The south coast of Chesapeako Bay is flat and sandy. Sand grass and low bushes grow close to the high water mark. In the background between Cape Henry and Lynnhaven Inlet are pine trees and farther back are sandhills and dunes.

The tracks of the Norfolk Southern Railroad across Lynnhaven Inlet on a wooden bridge. The two uprights at the draw in the bridge furnish a prominent landmark for Lynnhaven Roads. Bayville Chimmey which is about 1.5 miles WSW of this drawbridge is the most prominent landmark in that locality.

The same kind of shore line with bushes and trees in the back-ground continues from Lynnhaven Inlet about 8 miles to the West.

Fishermans huts and a few scattered cottages are the only buildings along the shore.

The Cottage Line of electric cars extends two miles eastward from Ocean View Hotel. Along both sides of the tracks are cottages. Close by Ocean View Hotel are several pavilions devoted to summer amisements. Ocean View is connected with Norfolk, Va., by two lines of street cars. To the west of Ocean View there is a line of cottages on either side of the cars tracks, which run to the end of Willoughby Spit. Near the end of the Spit the cottages are more scattered. There is a wharf at the end of Willoughby Spit where the Steamers from Old Point land to connect with the electric car line to Norfolk. This wherf is partly covered by a small yellow structure. Just to the eastward of this wharf is an anchorage for small boats off the Hampton Roads Yacht Club.

The eastern and southern shores of Willoughby Bay are higher than the northern shore; trees and grass grow close to the water's edge.

The land about Mason's Creek is swampy and covered with marsh grass. To the westward the Jamestown Exposition buildings are on higher ground. Several of these buildings have been torn down and several have been moved to other parts of the grounds since the Exposition.

To the west of the Exposition Grounds is the Pine Beach Hotel which has several cupolas. About a third of a mile S.W. of the Hotel is the landing for the Newport News Ferries. This wharf is connected to Ocean View as well as Norfolk, Va., by electric cars lines.

The Two old towers of the Jemestown Exposition, together with the Sewall's Point Coal Piers are very prominent landmarks for the vicinity of Sewall's Point. At night the coal piers are brilliently illuminated.

During the summer menths the amusement resort at Ocean View is illuminated at night and is very conspicuous from all directions to the northward.

This topography was executed by G. H. Durgin, Deck Officer excepting from Mason's Creek westward which was done by L. D. Graham, Aid.

Accompanying this report is a list of prominent objects and the discriptions of all the hydrographic signals located by the plane table.
