Descriptive Report

N.H. Heck, Chief of Party.

The topography on this sheet includes Yeopim River and Yeopim Creek. In addition, plane table traverses were run along the north shore of Albemarle Sound on both sides of the mouth of the river for the purpose of locating hydrographic signals, the topography having been done on the 40000 sheet by the party on the Hydrographer. For the control two triangulatin stations were located at at the mouth of the river, and using these as a base a system of sextant triangulation was carried up the river. Plane co-ordinates were used in computing the positions of the signals. For Yeopim Creek a plane table traverse was used.

The shores of Yeopiam River and Creek are heavily wooded, and there is very little cleared land. There are no settlements and very few houses along the river. There is very little traffic. Harris! Wharf, on the north shore is the only wharf. Considerable logging is carried on on the south shore.
