SEASON'S REPORT ON THE CADASTRAL SURVEY OF CULKBRA ISLAND, WEST INDIES.

STRAMER RANGER APRIL-JUNE 1924, C.C. MATTISON, Commanding.

The cadastral survey of Haval property on Calebra Island, adjacent to porto Rice, was started on April 14,1924, under radio instructions dated April 8,1924. The survey was completed June 14,1924.

Delay in submitting this report is due to the fact that instructions were received to do additional work, but this was later cancelled. Mr. A. Ogram, Aid, who made the survey, has since resigned from the service. He left rather complete notes which are being forwarded by registered mail.

On April 14,1924, Mr. Ogram was placed ashors at Great Harbor on Salebra with such instruments and equipment as he might need in the survey. All of thepersonnel in his party were inhabitants of Calebra, Mr. Ogram employing them as hands. The RANGER visited the party at intervals of approximately two weeks to furnish supplies or needed equipment and for consultations.

A great deal of difficulty was experienced as to the number of plots to be surveyed. Apparently there was no records or deeds, and the only authority for the limits of Maval Property are the various notes unde by the surveyors. Copies of these were obtained and adjustments made between them as described in the notes. It is probable that other property on the island belongs to the Mavy, but without further authority, it was deemed inadvisable to survey any areas outside of those contained in the notes of previous surveys.

Several corners were marked with concrete monuments and brass disks as requested by Mayal authorities at St. Thomas. Mr. Ogram used his discretion as to the kind of monuments to be used an some lines. It has been our experience that survey monuments are not cafe anywheres on Culebra Island, and it proved a question of cheesing the type that would be least conspicuous.

A tracing of the property on a scale of 1/10,000 was furnish the Governor of the Virgin Islands. A copy of the field notes was also turned over to him. The original drawing and the original notes are being forwarded to you under separate cover for disposition.
