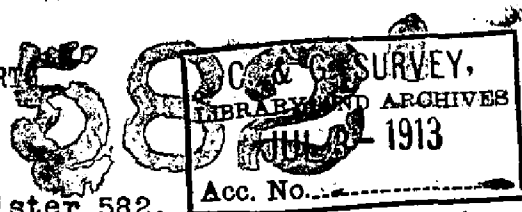

The wharves at Point Wilson are shown on this copy of the original sheet. Their positions were determined by running a section of the shore line in the vicinity and transferring from the field sheet to this copy by the shore line. Field sheet also sent herewith.

The wharves and buildings at Marrowstone Point and Admiralty Head are on military reservations and at the suggestion of the commanding Officer at Fort Worden, who is in command of this vicinity, in place of making a re-survey, tracings of the blue prints of the late surveys of the Engineer Corps of the Army have been made and are sent herewith. The positions of the wharves and buildings are not shown on the copies of the original sheets as I have no adequate facilities for reducing or enlarging their scales.

The tracing of the vicinity of Admiralty Head shows the road from the Head to Coupeville as well as the positions of the wharves at Coupeville and San de Fuca. As this survey is a carefully made one with transit and stadia, it should be a good check on the positions of the above wharves as determined by myself a couple of weeks ago.

A tracing of the shore line at Point Wilson is also enclosed. This tracing shows the wharves on this point in detail on a scale of 200 feet to the inch or 1:2400
