INSTRUCTIONS:

The work covered by this report was performed in accordance with Paragraph 8, Instructions, Project C.S.-265, dated May 7, 1941, referenced 22 mjc - 1995 OC 1.

SCALE:

The scale of this sheet is 1: 10000.

PURPOSE AND SCOPE OF WORK:

The primary purpose of this graphic control survey was to locate signals for control of hydrographic and wire drag surveys in the area. Since air photographic surveys for this area are contemplated in the near future no detailed topography was surveyed except the location of uncharted commercial wharves. The wharves of the Casco Bay Line were located. There are three of these within the area covered by this survey; one at Signal Red near the southwest tip of Orr Island; one at Signal Liza in Mackerel Cove on Bailey Island; and one at Signal Dock in Potts Harbor.

The pleasure pier located at Latitude 43° 45', Longitude 70° 01.4' was rodded in when a setup was made at Signal Us. There are a number of similar piers throughout this area but no special effort was made to locate them because they consist only of a catwalk supported by stone cribs which lead out to the low water line. During the summer season floats are moored off the outer end of such piers. These floats are beached during the winter.

LIMITS:

The work on this sheet includes the location of signals on the eastern shore of the southern part of Harpswell Neck, on the southern end of Orr Island, on Bailey, Pond, Jaquish, Turnip, Ram, and Great Mark Islands, and on the eastern side of Haskell Island. This sheet overlaps Sheets G (field) and K (field) on the west. The work was not extended beyond the northern or eastern limit of this sheet.

T-6929a(1942) on morele T-6929b(1942) on east METHODS:

The work on this sheet was done in accordance with general practice on graphic control surveys. Most of the signals were located by three or more cuts taken from triangulation stations or previously located graphic control stations. Some of the signals in the northern part of Potts Harbor and in Mackeral Cove were located by two cuts and a rod reading. In the little cove at the southern end of Orr Island five (5) signals were located by a single cut and rod reading.

GEOGRAPHIC NAMES:

No investigation was made of the geographic names in this area.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR ADDITIONAL WORK:

A new detailed topographic survey of this area is recommended.

STATISTICS:

One hundred three (103) signals were located on this sheet.

LANDMARKS:

Landmarks recommended for charting in this area were made the subject of a separate report.

MARKED GRAPHIC CONTROL STATIONS

In accordance with instructions in the Director's letter No. 22, MJC 1995 OC 4, dated August 20, 1941, three graphic control stations in the area of this survey were permanently marked with hydrographic station marks. The field work on this survey had been completed when these instructions were received so one of the marks was set eccentric to the located signal, tied in by distance and direction, and then plotted on the sheet.

The marks were set as follows:

Mark set on range between signal AJAX and signal HAT, 3.20 meters (10.5 ft.) from signal AJAX.

Same position as signal DOE.
