

#### SUMMARY TO ACCOMPANY DESCRIPTIVE REPORTS

TP-00640 through TP-00643

Project CM-7213 consists of four 1:10,000 scale maps covering the Gunpowder River, extending from Hawk Cove and Pooles Island at the southern end to Gunpowder Falls and Lauderick Creek at the northern end. The purpose was to provide support for the contemporary hydrographic operations in the area and to supply current shoreline for nautical chart construction.

Field work prior to compilation was limited to the recovery and identification of horizontal control for bridging purposes.

Compilation was done at the Atlantic Marine Center by Wild B-8 stereoplotter method, using 1:30,000 scale color infrared photography.

Field edit was accomplished in July and August 1974 and applied at AMC in September and October 1974.

Final review was done at AMC in May 1977.

The original stabelene base manuscripts were forwarded to the Rockville Office for reproduction and final registration.

#### FIELD INSPECTION

### TP-00643

There was no field inspection prior to compilation. Field work accomplished was limited to the recovery and identification of the horizontal control necessary for the bridging.

#### PHOTOGRAMMETRIC PLOT REPORT Job CM-7213 Gunpowder River, Maryland 2 October 1973

#### 21. Area Covered

The area covered in this report extends from Hart Island to the head water of Gunpowder River. The area is covered by four 1:10,000 scale sheets, TP-00640 thru TP-00643.

#### 22. Method

Three strips of 1:30,000 color infrared photography were bridged on the Zeiss C-8 stereoplanograph and adjusted by the IBM computer. The three strips were used to obtain passpoint positions for the models and to determine the scale ratio for the strips.

Strip #1 (72L(c) infrared 144 thru 153) was adjusted on seven field-identified horizontal stations and three horizontal tie stations of strip 72L(c) 126 thru 133. Six field-identified horizontal stations and two horizontal tie stations were used as checks. Difficulty in adjusting the strip occurred from photo 72L(c) 144 thru 146 where photo coverage was weak (less than one-half of the models were set on the Zeiss C-8).

Strip #2 (72L(c) 099 thru 105 infrared) was adjusted on six field-identified horizontal stations and one horizontal tie station. Six field identified stations and four horizontal tie stations were used as checks. Photo 72L(c) 106 is to be compiled on three field identified positions: (1) Ricketts (temp) A & B; (2) Pooles Island Light House, 1843, r. 1961; (3) Donna (temp) A & B.

Strip #3 (72L(c) 126 thru 133 infrared) was adjusted on five field-identified horizontal stations and eight field-identified horizontal stations were used as checks.

Data for ruling the projections were furnished to the Coradomat to be plotted on the Maryland State Plane Coordinate System.

#### 23. Adequacy of Control

Horizontal control complied with project instructions and held within the National Map Accuracy Standard.

#### 24. Supplemental Data

All vertical control needed for adjustment was taken from USGS quadrangles and approximate mean sea level. The vertical control data obtained by bridging are not necessarily true values.

#### 25. Photography

Photography was adequate as to overlap, definition, and coverage.



#### 51. METHUDS

All work was done in accordance with Provisional Photogrammetry Instructions-Field Edit Surveys, current photo-instructions, and Project Instructions OPR-510-AHP-74, Gunpowder River, Md. dated December 14, 1973.

An inspection of all shoreline and alongshore features was made, and all deletions, additions, and corrections are either shown or referenced on the field edit paper ozalid. All field edit notes are in purple ink for additions and corrections and in green ink for deletions.

Brief searches by boat for reported features below the mean high water line (eg. wrecks, piling, rocks) were made. Because of the limited visibility into the water and lack of wire drag gear, any negative findings noted in the field edit data should not be considered conclusive, unless otherwise stated. Consultathe latest hydrographic survey for more complete information.

Most of the field edit inspection was accomplished by boat. Features were located by either sextant fixes or photo identification. Landmarks and aids to navigation were located either by photo identification or control survey methods.

#### 52. ADEQUACY OF COMPILATION

Compilation of shoreline and alongshore features was generally adequate, except as noted below. Compilation will be complete when field edit notes are applied.

A majority of the land and water area of this sheet is part of the U.S. Army Aberdeen Proving Ground. Land access in general is blocked to the public, and navigation in these waters is restricted. Refer to the pamphlet titled "Boater's Guide to Restricted Water Zone" included with the field edit data for TP-00641.

Ricketts Point is now a detached island (lat. 39° 18.1, lon. 76° 17.8'), as noted on photo NOS 10CT72L105. Large areas of water in Gunpowder River contain underwater weeds during the summer months. These areas were compiled as grass in water. These areas do not inhibit navigation and should not be considered hazardous.

#### 54. RECOMMENDATIONS

None.

#### 56. GEOGRAPHIC NAMES

No discrepencies were found while editing this sheet.

#### 57. LANDMARKS AND AIDS TO NAVIGATION

There are two landmark observation towers and a landkmark abandoned lighthouse on Pooles Island. Four non-floating aids-Pooles Island South Range Rear Light, Pooles Island North Range Rear Light, Pooles Island South Range Front Light and Pooles Island North Range Front Light-are located on Pooles Island. The two rear range lights are the same structure.

Robins Point Light and Pooles Island Bar Light are the final two aids recommended for charting. Pooles Island Bar Light is a triangulation station named LIGHTHOUSE SOUTH OF POOLES ISLAND, 1935.

Forms 76-40 have been completed for the above.

#### 61. GENERAL STATEMENT:

See Summary, which is Page 6 of this Descriptive Report.

An abandoned lighthouse and a tower located on the northwest shore of Pooles Island appear very similar in size, shape, and height as viewed on the photographs. The lighthouse was recommended as a landmark (Pooles Island Lighthouse, 1842). The tower located seaward of it was not recommended as a landmark; yet, two towers to the south, apparently identical to the seaward tower, were recommended as landmarks. A definite statement by some field observer as to the relative prominence of the two north towers is needed for clarification. The chart should show, either by note or symbolization, that both a tower and a lighthouse exist there.

Trees considered of landmark value by the field editor were delineated at Carroll Point.

#### 62. COMPARISON WITH REGISTERED TOPOGRAPHIC SURVEYS:

Comparison was made with incomplete Manuscripts T-11944, T-11945, T-11949 and T-11950, each 1:10,000 scale, compiled 1962. The grass in water shown on these maps at Carroll Point is not hazardous to navigation according to the field editor and is, therefore, not shown on TP-00643.

TP-00643 supersedes the above mentioned surveys for nautical chart construction.

#### 63. COMPARISON WITH MAPS OF OTHER AGENCIES:

Comparison was made with USGS Quadrangle GUNPOWDER NECK, MARYLAND, 1:24,000 scale, dated 1949, photorevised 1970.

The shorelines at Carroll Point and Rickett Point have eroded so that now, in both instances, the points of land have become islands. Spry Island appears on the

photographs as a small and rather indistinct image. Its true limits cannot be discerned and, therefore, it is not shown on this map.

#### 64. COMPARISON WITH CONTEMPORARY HYDROGRAPHIC SURVEYS:

Comparison was made with Verified Smoothsheet H-9454 (AHP 10-4-74). A shoal area visible on the photography at Long. 760 18.81 has apparently dissipated. Lat. 390 17.81 Four-foot soundings are shown on the verified smoothsheet in this area. The shoal was removed from the map to avoid confusion and conflict. H-9454 covers the Gunpowder River area only.

#### 65. COMPARISON WITH NAUTICAL CHARTS:

Comparison was made with Charts 12278, 44th edition, dated January 1, 1977; and 12274, 15th edition, dated November 27, 1976; each 1:40,000 scale.

Spry Island Shoal and two smaller shoals to the east of it are not shown on this map. See Paragraphs 63 and 64 above. Grass in water charted off the west shore of Gunpowder Neck is considered by the field editor not to be hazardous to navigation and is, therefore, not shown on this map.

#### 66. ADEQUACY OF RESULTS AND FUTURE SURVEYS:

This map complies with the Project Instructions and meets the requirement for Bureau Standards and the National Standards of Map Accuracy.
