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1. List of names occurring on plan table sheet embracing the city of Baton Rouge and vicinity.

The road bounding the sheet on the eastern side above the city is known as the Bayou Sara & Port Hudson road. All the timber land above the parallel of  $30^{\circ}29'$  is owned by M. K. Knox. The small cultivated field, of a triangular shape in the N. W. corner is owned by Thos. McGregor. The only other independent proprietors above the city are Ph. Buschell and C. W. Brown & <sup>J. D. Dougherty</sup> The U. S. Reservation extends from the intersection of the Bayou Sara Road to the southern side of Bayou Gracien. The northern limit is very nearly a straight line, the direction of which is given by the fence forming the boundary of Ph. Buschell's property. Bayou Gracien at the time of survey was quite full of water but as a general thing is a very small thread. Just below the mouth of the Bayou are the U. S. Barracks. The only two large buildings in the city are the State cap.

side. The first plantation below the  
city is known as Magnolia Mound  
and is owned by Chas. Wicks. It extends  
from the city limits to North Base  
point. The next is "Gartness"  
Plantation owned by Merrick William.  
The next is a small tract of land

is at present in litigation. The last  
plantation on the sheet is known  
as "Arlington". It is owned by
