

DISCRIPTION REPORT TO ACCOMPANY TOPOGRAPHIC SHEET "A"

NAKED ISLAND, PRINCE WILLIAM SOUND, ALASKA,

SEASON 1911

This sheet covers the southern side of Naked Island, Prince William Sound, Alaska. From seaward to the south the island gives the appearance of a ridge 400 feet high extending from the west side about 1/3 the length of the island and terminating in a peak 705 feet high. The eastern side rises to a peak 1235 feet high. The whole island is wooded.

The coast is rocky and generaly steep, on an average 15 reet high. Numerous rocks lie along and near the shore, but most of them show at H.W. The tree line extends to the H.W. line.

PARROT ISLAND.

Parrot Island is a small island 1/3 mile long(N. E. & S. W.) and 1/4 mile wide and lying $\frac{3}{4}$ mile off the eastern point that form s the entrance to Bass Harbor. The shore is rocky and many rocks lie for a distance of 50 meters off it. On the N. E. end of the island there is a reef extending for 80 meters from the shore. The island is heavily wooded. Owing to the thick underbrush and fallen logs, and grass traveling acrossed the island difficult.

(BARREN BAY)

Barren bay is the first bay from the south on the western sideof Naked Island. The small bight on the south side of the bay is a good anchorage for boats up to 50 tens. The bottom is sticky in 8 fathoms of water. There is a small stream of fresh water that flows all summer.

BASS HARBOR

Is on the south side of Naked Island. Although the bay is clear of rocks it is of no value as an anchorage for the bottom is either hard or sandy and the water deep. The small bay in the eastern shore of the large bay is a better anchorage for small boats.

FOINT BLUFF

Is on the southern shore of the island. The point is 30 feet high. Small boats rounding the point must not cut in to closely as there are several covered rocks 75 meters off the shore.

GULL ROOK

Is a round topped rock lying 300 meters off the south east corner of the island. It is 15 meters wide and 10 meters long. At extreme high tide it covers but at all other times it is easily seen. Kelp extends between the rock and the island, and for 15 meters to the south, but there is none on the outer side. The space between the rock and the shore is foul, especially towards the point.

SURVEY METHODS.

The survey was made entirely with the Plane Table. The work began at a triangulation station at Point Tuft and went both ways. The western limit was
terminated and checked by another triangulation station. In running east from
the starting point there were four triangulation stations on which to check the
orientation of the table. When Bass Harbor was reached the shore line was again
started at a triangulation station on the south east corner of Naked Island and
brought around to the harbor. The entire sheet was therefore constantly under
the controll of the triangulation stations.
